

BULK ITEM PICKUP: Rumpke will collect properly prepared large items on your pickup day along with your regular pickup. Please notify Rumpke 24 hours in advance to review preparation guidelines. Mattresses, box springs and upholstered furniture must be wrapped and sealed in plastic prior to collection. Freon must be properly removed. Visit www.rumpke.com for details. Freon containing appliances require special handling procedures prior to pick-up.

HOLIDAYS: Rumpke observes two holidays: Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Collection will be delayed one day during the holiday weeks.

Utilities (water, sewer & trash) -

Springboro Utility Department handles water, sewer and trash billing. Bills are generated the 1st of each month and due the 20th of each month.

From mid June through mid September a sewer reduction program is offered to all residents for grass watering.

The City of Springboro is located off Interstate 75 (Exit 38) in Warren County, 14 miles south of downtown Dayton and 37 miles north of downtown Cincinnati.

Springboro was incorporated as a village in 1815 and as a city in 1987.

The population of the City according to the 2010 census is 17,409.

Springboro covers a land area of 10 square miles and has 88 miles of streets.

Trash-

Rumpke provides trash hauling, recycling yard waste and bulk-item pickups for City residents. Collection days are Thursday or Friday, depending upon your address. To determine your service day, visit www.ci.springboro.oh.us or call the City, 937-748-4343.

TRASH CONTAINERS: You can use your own trash cans and trash bags. Rumpke 95-gallon carts (toters) are available for \$3 each per month. Call 1-800-828-8171 or email newcustomer02@rumpke.com for rental information.

TRASH COLLECTION: Place items at the curb the night before to ensure timely pick up. Separate trucks pickup trash, recycling, yard waste and bulk items. Bags and cans should not exceed 60 lbs. Drywall, concrete, bricks, dirt or rocks are not accepted. Contact Rumpke for disposal options. In accordance with federal law, Rumpke is not permitted to accept batteries, tires, liquids, combustible materials or any items identified as hazardous.

Missed service: If your household was missed, please call Rumpke, 1-800-828-8171, to report.

RECYCLING: Recycling is offered every-other-week on your service day. You will be on either the red or grey collection schedule. Check the street schedule on the website.

Recycling Toter: If your home does not have a recycling toter, call the City, 937-748-4343, and we will deliver one to you. The City of Springboro provides the toter at no charge.

YARD WASTE: Rumpke trucks pick up yard waste April 1 - December 31. Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in environmentally friendly composting bags available at any local hardware store. You may also use your own trash can, provided it is clearly marked as a yard waste container. Loose shrubbery must be bundled and tied in lengths no larger than 4 feet long and 2 feet wide. Bundles should not exceed 50 lbs.

Gardner Park - Village Park Boulevard -16 acres
Located on Village Park Blvd., behind the Village Park Development on North Main Street, Gardner Park offers a paved walking trail and pond. It is home to our Veterans Memorial.

Hazel Woods Park: 4000 Lower Springboro Road – 108 acres
Dog park, 1.1 mile walk path and future home for soccer, football and lacrosse fields.

Kacie Jane Park: West Lytle-5 Points Road – 5 acres
Opened in 2019 and features a splash pad and shelter. Phase 2 featuring 3 playgrounds will open in 2020.

Rotary Park - South Main Street
Located in the 300 block of South Main Street in the Historic District, Rotary Park offers a gazebo and benches for sitting and enjoying our quaint downtown. Rotary Park was made possible through a collaboration between the City and the Rotary Club of Springboro.

SPARC and Go - South Main Street
Rotary Park also contains one of the City's newest concepts - SPARC and Go. SPARC stands for Springboro Area Recharging Center. Built as part of the City's Bike and Pedestrian Plan, the SPARC and Go acts as a rest station for bicyclists as well as a recharging center during power outages or natural disasters.

Parks - The **City of Springboro** operates and maintains the following recreational parks:

North Park - 195 Tamarack Trail - 39 acres

North Park is located on Tamarack Trail and has 2 lighted tennis courts, 3 soccer fields, 1 shelter, 1 playground area, a concession stand, .89 mile walking trail and offers a concert series in July and theatre under the stars in August by the Springboro Community Theatre at the amphitheater.

Community Park - 666 West Market Street - 18 acres

Located on Market Street, Community Park has 2 lighted tennis courts, 1 basketball court, 2 baseball fields, 2 playground areas, 2 shelter houses, 1 concession stand and 2 equipment buildings.

Clearcreek Park - 500 Lower Springboro Road - 137.5 acres

Located on Lower Springboro Road, Clearcreek Park offers 10 soccer fields, 8 baseball/softball diamonds, 2 football/soccer/LAX fields, 1 shelter, 2 playgrounds and a concession stand.

E. Milo Beck - Lower Springboro Road - 85 acres

Located on Lower Springboro Road at the terminus of Pioneer Blvd., E. Milo Beck is a passive park with an overlook area and walking trails.

- use your cell phone as your primary phone number,
- use TDD/TTY equipment, and/or you are a business. Note that businesses are not automatically on CodeRED calling lists.
