Residential Code of Ohio Energy Requirements

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The 2019 Residential Code of Ohio (RCO) allows multiple methods to demonstrate energy code compliance for 1-, 2-, and 3- family residential dwellings. **Please check the applicable design method chosen to demonstrate compliance (CHOOSE ONLY ONE):**

- Method #1:** Compliance with RCO Sections 1101.14 through 1104
- Method #2:** Compliance with RCO Section 1105 (the Simulated Performance approach) and the provisions of Sections 1101.14 through 1104 indicated as “Mandatory.”
- Method #3:** Compliance with RCO Section 1106 (the Energy Rating Index [ERI] approach) and the provisions of Sections 1101.14 through 1104 indicated as “Mandatory” and Section 1103.5.3.
- Method #4:** Compliance with RCO Section 1112 (The Ohio Home Builder’s Association [OHBA] Alternative Energy Code Option).
- Method #5:** Compliance with the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code.

RCO required testing:

1. Air Leakage Testing (1102.4.1.2 & 1112.2.4.2)
 2. Duct Testing (1103.3.3 & 1112.3.2) Duct testing is **not required** if the air handler and ductwork are located entirely within the conditioned space.
- ❖ Outdoor air ducts connected to the return side of an air handler **SHALL** be provided per RCO 303.4 & 1505.4.
 - ❖ A permanent certificate shall be posted per Section 1101.14 at the time of final inspection regardless of compliance method chosen.
 - ❖ A written report of the results of the duct testing shall be signed by the party conducting the test and provided to the building department at the time of final inspection.
